## ICAR-Indian institute of Rice Research

The Hyderabad-based ICAR-Indian Institute of Rice Research (IIRR) celebrated Farmers' Day on November 7, 2025, at its Rajendranagar campus. The event witnessed the active participation of around 400 farmers from Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Punjab, and Karnataka.

As part of the programme, a field visit was organized to familiarize farmers with improved rice production technologies and management practices.
